The book felt personal, as many things that take place in the privacy of our own homes do. But if anything, living through the pandemic has exposed the real impact of depending on women to carry the burden of the "second shift" disproportionately. The problem of dividing domestic labor isn't just personal, it's widespread and systemic and it's caused more than 2.5 million women to leave the workforce in the last twelve months alone, at four times the rate of men.

In The Husbands I hope you'll find a big, juicy murder mystery with something to say and I'm so pleased it's your book club pick.

THE HUSBANDS asks: to what lengths will a woman go for a little more help from her husband?

Nora Spangler is a successful attorney but when it comes to domestic life, she packs the lunches, schedules the doctor appointments, knows where the extra paper towel rolls are, and designs and orders the holiday cards. Her husband works hard, too... but why does it seem like she is always working so much harder?

When the Spanglers go house hunting in Dynasty Ranch, an exclusive suburban neighborhood, Nora meets a group of highpowered women--a tech CEO, a neurosurgeon, an awardwinning therapist, a bestselling author--with enviably supportive husbands. When she agrees to help with a resident's wrongful death case, she is pulled into the lives of the women there. She finds the air is different in Dynasty Ranch. The women aren't hanging on by a thread.

But as the case unravels, Nora uncovers a plot that may explain the secret to having-it-all. One that's worth killing for. Calling to mind a Stepford Wives gender-swap, The Husbands imagines a world where the burden of the "second shift" is equally shared --and what it may take to get there.


## Menw FIRE ROASTED TOMATO CAPRESE

2 pints fire roasted cherry tomatoes
4 sprigs thyme
4 garlic cloves, smashed $1 / 4$ cup extra-virgin olive oil Kosher salt
8 ounces fresh buffalo or cow mozzarella (about 1 ball), room temperature, torn into large pieces Flaky sea salt
Country-style bread, brushed with oil, toasted in oven (for serving)

## PREPARATION

## Step 1

Preheat oven to $350^{\circ}$. Toss tomatoes, thyme, garlic, and oil on a rimmed baking sheet to coat and season lightly with kosher salt. Spread out in a single layer and roast until tomatoes are bursting and lightly browned, 40-45 minutes; letcool.

## Step 2

Arrange mozzarella on a platter and spoon warm tomato mixture with juices over; sprinkle with sea salt. Serve with olive-oil-toasted bread for soaking up all those extra juices.

Do Ahead: Tomatoes can be roasted 1 day ahead. Cover and chill. Gently reheat before using.

3. The book spends a significant amount of time exploring the plight of the working mother through the eyes of Nora, but how does the undue burden of domestic and emotional labor negatively impact not just mothers but all women?
4. Can a husband know what a $50 / 50$ split of domestic labor looks like when they've never shouldered all of it before?
5. Comparisons are often drawn between The Husbands and The Stepford Wives. What is the difference between the Stepford wives and the husbands in this novel?
6. Cornelia seems to live by a code of teleological ethics, believing that if the goal is morally important enough, any method of achieving it is acceptable. Up to what point were you willing to buy into Cornelia's logic? Is there a moment when you think Cornelia broke with her own moral code?
7. Penny specializes in giving warm, thoughtful advice. What is the kindest piece of advice you could offer to yourself during this period of your life?
8. Do you feel sorry for the men of Dynasty Ranch? Why or why not?
9. What do you make of Nora's decision in the last line of the book? Were you surprised? Did you find this final choice in or out of character for her? How so? Is she justified?
10. Let's say tomorrow you are given the keys to a new house in Dynasty Ranch complete with all the amenities. How does your life change?
